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COVID Update

Another RAT kit will be sent home with the students today. These are to be used over the next two weeks, on Mondays & Wednesday/Thursdays. We have been fortunate as a school to have had quite a low incidence of COVID cases so I thank everyone in our school community for the care taken in protecting ourselves and each other.

There is a change to previous advice, that being, if a student or staff member tests positive through a rapid antigen test, but does not have symptoms or has not been in contact with anyone who has COVID-19, it is recommended that they get a PCR test within 48 hours and stay isolated until they receive their result. If the PCR test is negative, the student or staff member can return to school.
