Principal's Message

From our Principal Mr Michael Gavaghan

Dear Parents & Carers,

Last Tuesday evening I was privileged to attend the celebration of First Eucharist for our Catholic Year 4 students. It was a wonderfully reverent occasion that reflected the importance of the event for the students, their families and our staff. I'd like to thank Glenn Mugavin, Kat Eastman & Anne Go for their preparation of the children. Thanks also to our staff, who were there in numbers to demonstrate their support. The choir made the celebration a joyous occasion led by Susanne Sweeny and supported by the keyboard skills of _______.

For the past few weeks the teachers have been preparing the first semester reports of their students. The reports will be emailed home on Monday 24 June and they will be accompanied by 3 way conversations, held on Tuesday 25 June and Thursday 27 June. Booking instructions will be sent home early next week. Please note that school will finish at 1:00pm on Tuesday 25 June to enable enough time to hold the meetings.

I would like to commend the work of our Mini Vinnies, who were commissioned and blessed at last week's assembly. The Mini Vinnies have launched their winter appeal and families are encouraged to send along specific items of food and other requirements to be donated to the St Vincent de Paul Society to be distributed to needy families.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, <u>keeping your child home from school and other activities when they are sick with a cold can stop them spreading their illness to others</u>. While we appreciate it is not always easy to take time off work to care for a sick child, sending them to school means others, students & staff, are more susceptible to getting sick.

Some children continue to cough for many weeks after a cold — this is known as a post-viral cough. If your child has a cough but is otherwise well, check with your doctor if they can attend school.

COVID is also still circulating through the community. The most recent Department of Health advice recommends that a person diagnosed with COVID-19 should:

- isolate until 5 days after the date of the positive test result for COVID-19 and until resolution of acute symptoms of COVID-19.
- not leave isolation if experiencing acute symptoms of COVID-19: runny nose, sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, fever, chills and/or sweats.
- A negative rapid antigen test result is a helpful tool to determine if a case is likely to be no longer infectious but should be interpreted in conjunction with the case's symptoms and duration of illness.

Next Friday will be the Neon Disco, organised by the Parent Association. The F-2 Disco will be held from 2:00-3:00 and the Yr 3-6 Disco from 5:30-7:30. This is a fundraiser and students are asked to sign up sponsors as their entry. All students can participate whether they can fundraise or not. Information was sent home earlier this week to explain sponsorship and student prizes.

Term 2 finishes at 1:00pm on Friday 28 June 2024.

Student Wellbeing News

Our House Captains have done a fantastic job so far in running the Friendly Meeting Place during lunch. This week Mason, Adhar, Etain, and Mathilde ran a talent show. It was great to see students from F-6 join in.

The friendly meeting place is a structured play run by year 6 students. It promotes friendships across the school. The area serves as a space where students can retreat if they need some time out or in need of a friend.

Separation Anxiety reflects a child's fear or distress at the idea of being separated from their parents or caregivers. This heightened distress is often expressed with tears, clinginess, pleading, refusing to get dressed for school, or refusing to go to school.


Many children with Separation Anxiety also complain of an upset stomach, headache, or feeling sick. Below are some strategies that can help with separation anxiety:



- Talk to your child's teacher. It is important to talk to your child about their fears. Working in partnership increases success.
- Create predictable morning routines. Consider preparing their school bag and uniform the night before or waking up earlier. A visual checklist is a great idea.
- Outsource someone to do the drop-off (if possible). In many cases, there can be a substantial improvement in anxious behaviours when another parent, relative, or close friend takes your child to school.
- Be supportive yet firm. Remain calm and reassure your child that they are safe at school. Create a script e.g. "I can see it is hard for you to go to school today but you have to go to school."
- Deep questions when your child is calm e.g. after school ask questions around what fears they may have. Why is it hard for them? Together come up with a plan.

Resources

Books such as "The Invisible String" by Patrice Karst are also a great option to help children to normalise their worries and fears. This lovely picture book describes an 'invisible string' that connects us to our loved ones, no matter where they may be. A related activity could be to tie a string around your child's wrist and yours (you could even get creative and decorate it), as a reminder of the invisible string connecting you throughout the day.



Cue to start.....Live, Love, Learn

Using cues is one of many effective classroom management techniques. It is a cue (signal) to initiate directions and for students to shift their focus from one state of attention to 100% attention. At St Andrew's we have a whole school cue to start. This ensures consistency across the school, achieving success for all our staff and students.

When a teacher at St Andrew's wants their students to give 100% attention to the speaker they will say

"Live, Love..." and our students will respond with "Learn" Have a go practicing the signal with your child at home!




Some of our students have recorded instructions on how to register for the fundraising page of the Neon Disco in Vietnamese, Dinka, Chin, and Arabic.
