## Principal's Message

From our Principal Mr Michael Gavaghan

Dear Parents & Carers,

As we embark on the second semester of this school year, I am filled with enthusiasm and optimism for the opportunities that lie ahead. The first half of the year was marked by remarkable achievements and growth, and I am confident that we will continue to build on this momentum.

Our primary focus for this semester is to enhance student engagement in learning as we continue our involvement in the Flourishing Learners West initiative. As I have previously explained, this initiative involves many of the Catholic primary schools of the Western region working together with our regional consultants to implement Science of Learning and Science of Reading. During term 3 we will continue strengthening classroom mastery strategies and reimagine our whole school reading and spelling approach. At the same time we continue to work with the teachers in strengthening consistent use of teacher skills that support the changes being introduced. Our next pupil free day is on Friday 16 August, where the teachers will once again combine with over 600 other teachers with a learning focus on Reading & Spelling.

Highlights of this term will be:

- Book Week, to be held in the week of 19-23 August featuring a Book Week parade on Friday 23 August.
- Father's Day breakfast and footy day on Friday 30 August.
- Year 3 Camp to Sovereign Hill 21st & 22nd August.
- Year 5 Camp to Sunnystones 4th 6th September

This week illness has hit St. Andrew's hard and we have had to send many students home with gastro-like symptoms. Please assist us to reduce the spread of this highly transmissible illness by keeping students home if they are complaining of not feeling well. I understand that it is not always easy to provide care if they're at home but we are trying to keep our teachers healthy as well as the whole student body.

Principals in Catholic schools have a significant role in shaping the culture in which effective teaching and learning occurs in a Catholic context. Through engaging and inspiring the school community, principals develop a shared vision, mission and strategic direction for the school. They are learners themselves; constantly striving for improvement in all aspects of their leadership practice in order to enhance the outcomes for all students. In this spirit, MACS offers and expects principals to nourish their spiritual lives through faith formation activities.

### **Year 3 News**


#### From our Year 3A Teacher, Ms Tennille Purton

On Tuesday the 16th of July 2024, the Year 3s went back in time to the 1800's! We did our whole school day like the students of the past did. The teachers were very strict and if you were silly by talking without being told to or not listening you had to stand in the corner of the classroom. They also had a cane that they tapped on the table as they walked past. Our teachers dressed up and looked like they were from the past because they were wearing long blue dresses, bonnets, gloves and a shawl. Some of the teachers even dressed up like nuns. They were wearing a long brown dress that covered their whole body and they had a habit on their heads.

Every time a teacher entered the room we stood up and greeted them by saying "Good morning ma'am" or "Good morning Sir" as we bowed to them. We even had to hold our hands out everytime we entered the classroom for a hand inspection. If your hands were dirty or you had marker on them the teachers would say "Child! What is this? Go and wash your hands!"


We did lots of activities that were from the past. One of our favourites was making dolls out of pieces of material. We had to wrap it around a ball of paper and tie it together using a rubber band. Once it was secure, we used a pencil to draw a face on the doll. We also used a feather called a quill that we dipped in ink to write the alphabet in cursive. In the 1800's you were not allowed to be left handed, so some of us had to use our right hands which was a bit tricky. During our arithmetic lesson, we had to chant the times tables and then write it down on a chalkboard.

We had so much fun during our day in the past and most of us wish we could have school like it's the 1800's everyday!

On Friday the 19th of July, the Year 4 students went on an excursion to ACMI and the NGV in Melbourne.

At ACMI, we explored "The Story of the Moving Image" exhibition. This fascinating journey took us through the evolution of moving images, from ancient shadow puppets to contemporary art. We saw original cameras, iconic costumes, and movie sets, as well as sketches, clips, and artworks from various cultures and periods. We also used the Lens, a free tool provided by ACMI, to collect our favorite objects and artworks.

Following ACMI, we visited the National Gallery of Victoria. Stefania Fillipi, our Italian Language
Assistant, led us through the renaissance collection and provided background information to
some of the famous works displayed. This visit complemented our experience at ACMI by
providing a broader understanding of artistic expression and cultural heritage.
