



# **Principal's Message**

From our Principal Mr Michael Gavaghan

Dear Parents & Carers,

A belated welcome to Term 4.

On Wednesday evening, I attended the MacKillop College annual awards ceremony as the Year 12 class of 2024 were farewelled. I always have an acute interest in our past students and once again there were a number of St Andrew's students who received awards across years 7-12 across all fields, academic, sporting and musical. This year, Isabella Keogh in Year 12, was a stand out. Well done to all, you have done us proud.

In the next few weeks each family will receive a form to indicate your 2025 intentions. As always I urge any family who knows they are leaving to email me, <u>principal@sawerribee.catholic.edu.au</u>, as soon as possible as this will assist us with managing our enrolments. We have families who are waiting in hope to receive a place at St Andrew's.

Recently we introduced automated texts being sent to parents for students who are absent and have not notified the school. We have had some teething issues that Bianca, in our office, is working through. To assist us having accurate attendance data and to prevent unnecessary anxiety for you, the parents, we ask the following:

- Any child arriving after 9:00am must enter through the office and sign in on the iPad. Being at school on time is very important, there are a few families who need to set their alarms a little earlier. Being late should be the exception not the norm.
- Please notify the school using one of two modes. Either use Operoo or phone the school office. From now on we are encouraging families to not send REMIND messages as teachers are unable to check messages after 8:45am. Unread REMIND messages are contributing to some of our false alarm text messages.

On Tuesday evening the families of our Year 3 students, who are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Penance, gathered for a faith night. The evening was led by Glenn Mugavin, Catholic Identity Leader, who assisted families to prepare for the upcoming sacrament to be celebrated on Tuesday 29 October. Please keep these children and their families in your prayers.

Thunderstorm Asthma - we are now in the period of the year where thunderstorms are more frequent and with thunderstorms comes increased risk of asthma. To assist us manage your child's asthma in the event of an attack please ensure we have an updated Asthma plan for your child and that they have their appropriate medication available at school. This is a great time to review that everything associated with your child's asthma is up to date.

Please remember next Monday 21 October is a Pupil Free day, there will be no school for students. The teachers will once again be off site and the office will be closed. It is not too late to enrol your child for the Camp Australia pupil free day program. This will be free for families.

Please ensure that you are notifying the office or your child's teacher in the event of your child being away. You must give the reason for the absence.



### **SCHOOL SAVINGS BONUS**

- Catholic school students receiving the means-tested Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) are eligible for the Victorian Government's \$400 School Saving Bonus (SSB).
- Payments will be made directly to the school in November 2024 for eligible students expected to remain at that school in 2025. The government will email further information at the time.
- There is no separate application process for eligible Catholic school students to receive the SSB.


