Dear parents and carers,

Last Friday, St Andrew's was visited by an external coach from The Knowledge Society to observe our teachers and students during their Literacy lesson. The Knowledge Society is an organisation engaged by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools to support our transition to full implementation of Science of Learning as a theory and approach that underpins our pedagogy. The Science of Learning draws on cognitive science and connects it to practical implications for teaching. You may also have heard it referred to as the MACS Vision for Instruction or Flourishing Learners, an initiative of the Western Region Catholic schools.

The day finished with a feedback session in which the coach, who has been in numerous schools across the country, commended us for our commitment to consistent implementation across the school. Students from Foundation to Grade 6 are learning in the same consistent manner, explicit instruction for the core subjects of Literacy and Numeracy. For those Age newspaper readers, you may have seen a recent article that highlighted Bethany Primary School. The article was titled, "Catholic schools reap the benefits of 'back to basics' overhaul" We'll keep you updated on our progress.

School Saving Bonus (SSB)

Last year the Victorian Government announced the SSB as a cost of living assistance for eligible families. For non-government schools, the SSB is a \$400 bonus for students receiving the means-tested Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) in 2025. It is a one-off payment in addition to the CSEF payment of \$154.

- The bonus will be allocated to eligible students once the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) process has been completed for 2025.
- The SSB can be applied to the following programs/expenditure:

 o Camps, trips, excursions and incursions
 o Swimming and sporting programs
 o Outdoor education programs
 o Graduations
 o School uniforms, if purchased from an official uniform supplier
 - (tax invoice/receipt must be supplied by parents)
- SSB cannot be applied to tuition charges.
- The school is not required to provide families with the cash equivalent of the bonus.
- The SSB is intended for use in the 2025 school year (if possible) and the funds remain with the school.
- Families can apply the SSB to another child within their family, meaning that the SSB can be shared within a family.
- Unused SSB funds from 2025 can be carried over to 2026 if the school or families are not able to fully spend the bonus in a manner that will benefit the school/family in 2025.
- Schools are not required to return unspent funds if all students from the relevant family have graduated.
- Please be aware that the SSB will not appear on statements until CSEF eligibility is confirmed.
- Any family with a current Health Care Card must make an application for CSEF before receiving the SSB. Application forms for the CSEF are available at the school office. We encourage all eligible families to finalise their applications before March.

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) Concessional Fee Policy

For students with approved MACS Concessional Fee Policy (CFP), the CFP will be applied first (including CSEF of \$154) and then SSB to applicable items as listed earlier. This will be reflected on your school fee statement.

School Advisory Council (Urgent)

The School Advisory Council is looking for new members. The Council meets on approximately 6 occasions throughout the year, once in Term 1, twice in Terms 2 & 3 and once in Term 4. Meetings are normally held on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 and are scheduled to run for 90 minutes.

The School Advisory Council provides a forum for discussion and discernment, where the parent/guardian voice and perspective are available to inform and support the decisions made by the principal and parish priest for the good of school and parish where the wellbeing and outcomes for students is paramount.


